

Wakefield City Academy

In the academic year 2016-2017 Wakefield City Academy intends to spend the Pupil Premium of £248,242.50 on the following (of which £258,518 is expected as pupil premium monies)

**Focus on Learning in the curriculum**

Provision	Approximate Cost
Intervention groups for students at risk of underperforming at KS4 for English & maths.	£65,000
Intervention for students at KS3 and KS4 through “1 to 1” or small group support (particularly core subjects and Ebac).	£42,000
Small Literacy groups in curriculum time across all year groups to improve reading, writing, and spelling – small group interventions.	£6,500
Free instrument lessons are provided by the academy to ensure that pupil premium students are not discriminated against in terms of tuition. Instruments purchased for individual students.	£9,500
Additional curriculum funded to meet the needs of individual students – ie off-site learning, Young Fire Fighters, Hotchpotch, Lighthouse Group, Young Apprenticeships (Hair and Beauty, Construction)	£22,000
Academy provides all D&T material and other consumables so that pupil premium families are not disadvantaged in the learning and making of products.	£3,000
GCSE provision in home language – support for pupil premium to extend language skills and increase their chances of achieving GCSE.	£2,000

**Focus on Social Emotional and Behaviour**

Range of advice, guidance and support for students on issues relating to wellbeing and health – additional Educational Psychology: Student Services, outside agencies ie Connexions, Cross Project.	£52,000
Breakfast club every morning provides breakfast for students to ensure they are prepared for the day. Water provided for all students in the examinations in all year groups.	

Academy lunches subsidised for pupil premium to ensure they can have a full lunch and a drink.	£19,000

Home visits carried out by EWO and Academy Liaison Officer – paid by the academy to ensure that all families including pupil premium, hard to reach, vulnerable, CLA are contacted and communication is regular.	

Uniform items purchased and provided for some students to ensure they can attend in the correct uniform. Uniform loan systems in place for student struggling on certain days.	£2,000
Travel/bus fares paid for students who cannot afford the costs for YAPs, work experience, college courses and WRL visits.	£200
Academy minibus on hire purchase to ensure all children have transport to events and activities if parents cannot provide transport.	£4,000
